LISTENING FOR AND REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD

Scripture Reading: *read by Donna Price*

This morning, we have three readings on the theme of rest. One speaks of God resting, one speaks of the rest we can find in Jesus, and one is a translation of the 23rd Psalm which includes mention of how God offers us rest.

Genesis 1: 31 – 2:3 (New Revised Standard Version)

God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.

Thus the heavens and the earth were finished and all their multitude. On the sixth day God finished the work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all the work that he had done. So God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because on it God rested from all the work that he had done in creation.

Psalms 23 (New Living Translation)

The LORD is my shepherd; I have all that I need.

He lets me rest in green meadows;

he leads me beside peaceful streams.

He renews my strength.

He guides me along right paths, bringing honor to his name.

Even when I walk through the darkest valley,

I will not be afraid, for you are close beside me.
